

2 Thessalonians 3:6-13



About This Week's Music

The **prelude** is by Mykola Lysenko, the central figure of Ukrainian music in his time. Incredibly influential as a composer, pianist, and ethnomusicologist, he is credited with founding a national music tradition in Ukraine (like Edward Grieg in Norway, and Antonín Dvorak of the Czech Republic) by incorporating folk music, and utilizing the Ukrainian language, and distancing himself from Russian culture. The anthem is an exploration of peace. The fifteenth century text is taken from a much longer poem celebrating Jerusalem and the unmeasured praises sung about its everlasting light. Composer Abbie Betinis is also the co-founder of Justice Choir. For nearly three hundred years, the **postlude** was attributed to Bach, but through research undertaken by Bach scholar Alfred Durr in 1987, it is now believed to more likely have been written by one of Bach's students: Johann Ludwig Krebs, or Franz Anton Maichelbeck, or Johann Caspar Simon, or even Bach's eldest son Wilhelm Friedemann Bach.
