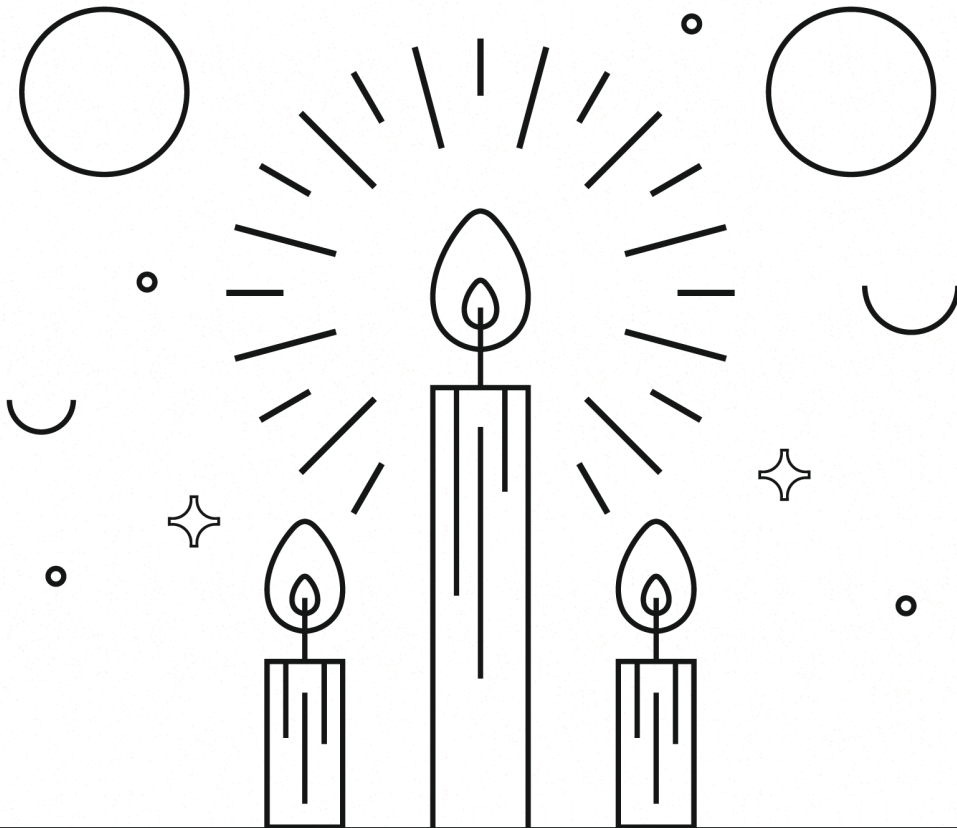

Children & Youth at SPR

Nursery, 9:00am-12:30pm

Professionally staffed nursery care is available during the service for children ages 0-4. The nursery is down the southwest stairs. Changing tables are in the downstairs restrooms and the nursery.

During the sermon at the 10:00am service, children from preschool to second grade are invited to a special liturgy in the children's chapel, featuring songs and a Bible story.

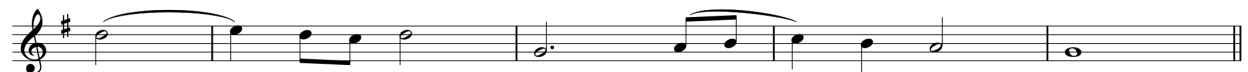

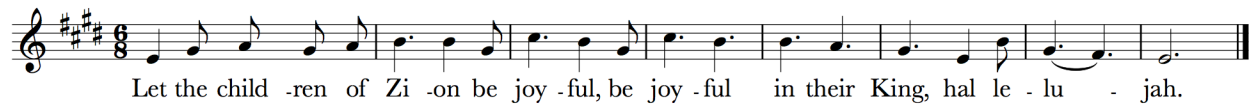

A reading from the letter to the Ephesians.

Ephesians 1:11-23

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

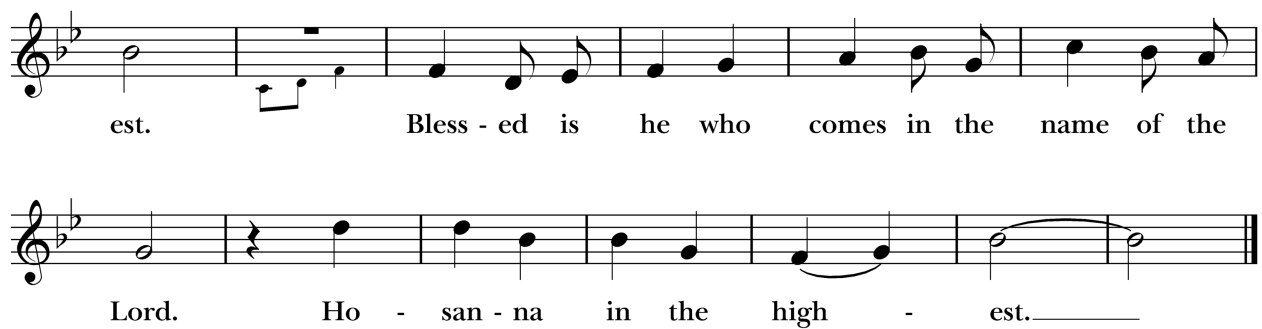

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **Amen.**



Guest Organist

We welcome organist **Meg Cutting** to play alongside the choir this morning. A native of Oregon, she studied at the Yale School of Music and the Eastman School of Music. She currently lives in Chicago after having recently completed her appointment as the Organ Scholar at St. James Cathedral.

About This Week's Music

The **prelude** by Franz Schubert is one of his few specifically-sacred *Lieder* (songs). While the original poem has nine verses, Schubert only chose to set three of them in his original publication. The **choral music** is by composer **Stephen Paulus** who is considered one of the mavericks of contemporary music. While he left a wildly diverse catalogue of music before his sudden death, he is most strongly associated with his vocal and choral music. *For All Saints: Four Songs on Sacred Texts* was a commission by the Episcopal Cathedral of St. Phillip in Atlanta, Georgia, and premiered there on All Saints' Day in 1990. *Hymn to the Eternal Flame* is from Paulus' landmark oratorio "To Be Certain of the Dawn," which was intended as a gift from the Christian community to the Jewish community. Written in 2005, it marked the sixtieth anniversary of the liberation of the death camps, and the fortieth anniversary of the Vatican document *Nostra Aetate* (In Our Time), which had much to do with the renewal of dialogue between Jews and Christians. *Hymn to the Eternal Flame* is the conclusion of the second half, "Remembrance," and is based on the children's memorial of multiple reflected flames at Yad Vashem in Jerusalem. The **postlude** features the music of organist and composer David Hurd, who served 40 years as the Director of Chapel Music and Professor of Church Music at General Theological Seminary in New York City. The Toccata is first movement from his *Te Deum*, which uses the traditional solemn tone from the first verse of the Latin Hymn *Te Deum* ("We praise Thee, O God").
